

RECOMMENDED SCHOLARSHIP POLICIES

1. The College should maintain a fund for the purpose of awarding

scholarships to students who are exceptionally qualified in their field of study and who are financially needy. It should be understood that the fund will be subject to annual review.

2. The Foundation's primary duty is to raise funds for the award of scholarships. Funds thus raised should be deposited in a separate fund, the proceeds of which should be used for the award of scholarships. The Foundation should also be authorized to accept gifts and bequests for the purpose of awarding scholarships. In order to maintain the integrity of the fund, the proceeds of such gifts and bequests should be deposited in a separate fund, the proceeds of which should be used for the award of scholarships. 3. The total amount raised by any individual source will be subject to the discretion of the Board of Trustees, subject to the requirements of the governing documents.

4. The criteria for selection:
